The HIPPY transition
consultations demonstrated
the power of respectful,
relational and
community-paced
engagement – reflecting a
shared commitment between
SNAICC and the Brotherhood
of St Laurence to walk
alongside community,
not ahead of it.

This model was not simply about service transition – it was about honouring selfdetermination, cultural governance and the sovereign voices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

# Supporting self-determination and Improving outcomes for First-Nations Families.


